## Licensed Treatment

**POWER House**, our 25-bed halfway house program, offers quality inpatient care in a safe and healing environment. Women stay at POWER House for up to six months while they receive treatment, including psychiatric and healthcare services, and build a strong foundation in recovery as they begin to reconnect with the community.

**POWER New Day Outpatient** provides outpatient services including partial hospitalization, intensive outpatient programming (IOP), and regular outpatient counseling. Group and individual therapy, resource coordination, and psychiatric services are offered to all clients. Childcare assistance and transportation assistance are also available.

## Recovery Support

**POWER Connection** provides in-home drug and alcohol assessment and mentoring to women, including those involved with Allegheny County's Department of Human Services, Office of Children, Youth and Families (CYF), Magee-Womens Hospital of UPMC, and other referral sources. These services are available to women who may be high risk, such as women who are pregnant, homeless, or victims of violence.
